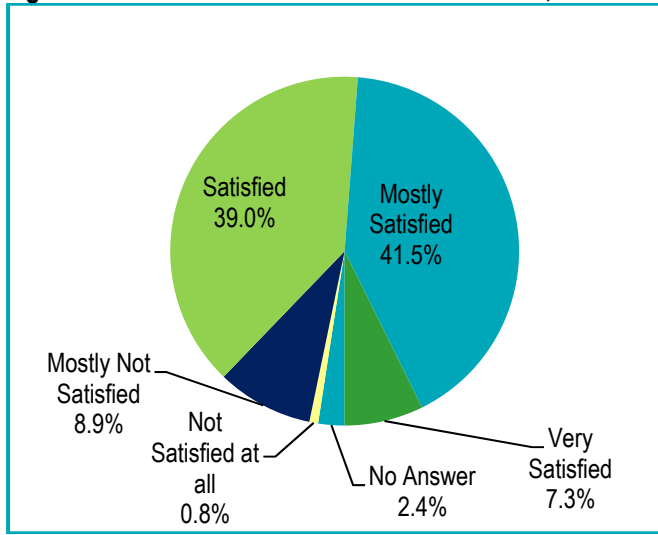

Figure 1. Satisfaction with health care services, 2009.

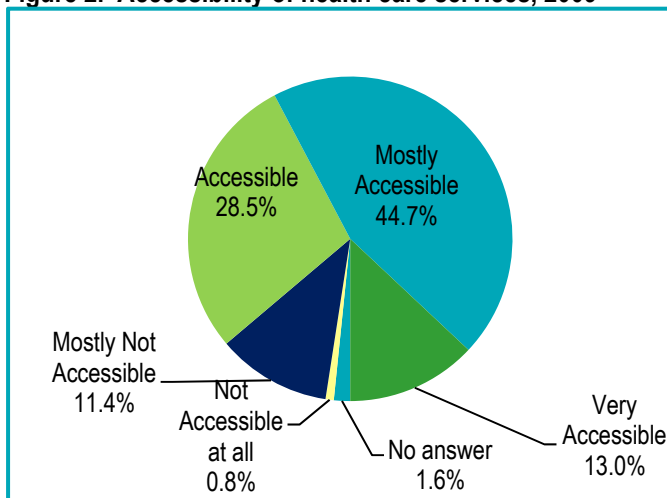

Figure 2. Accessibility of health care services, 2009



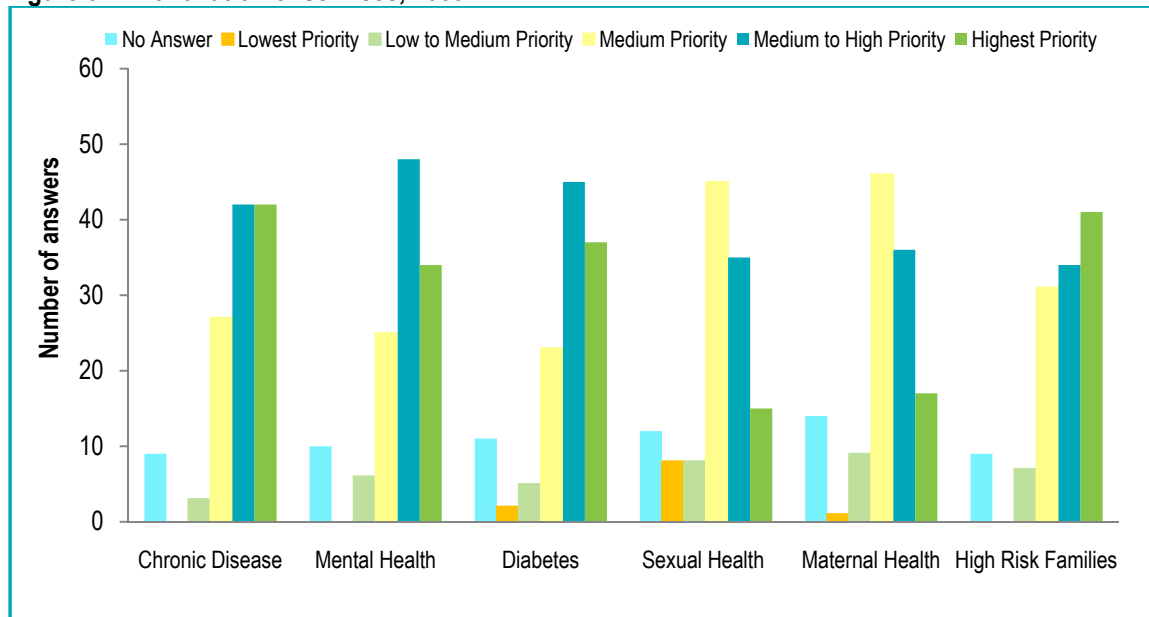

**Figure 3. Prioritization of services, 2009.**



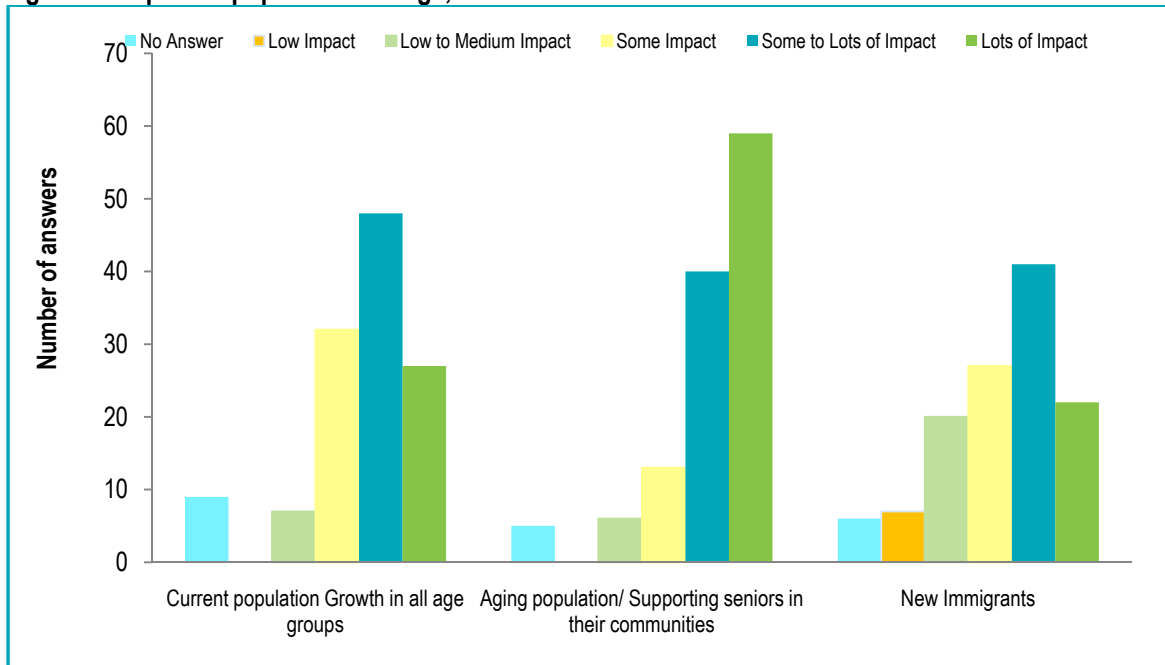

**Figure 4. Impact of population change, 2009.**



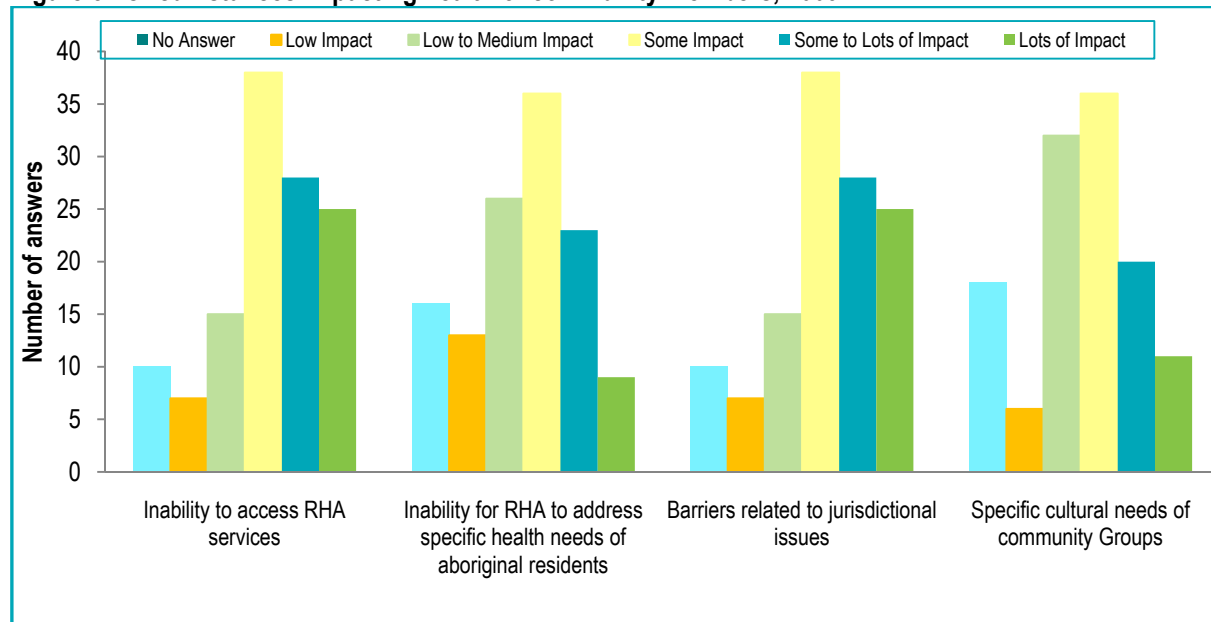

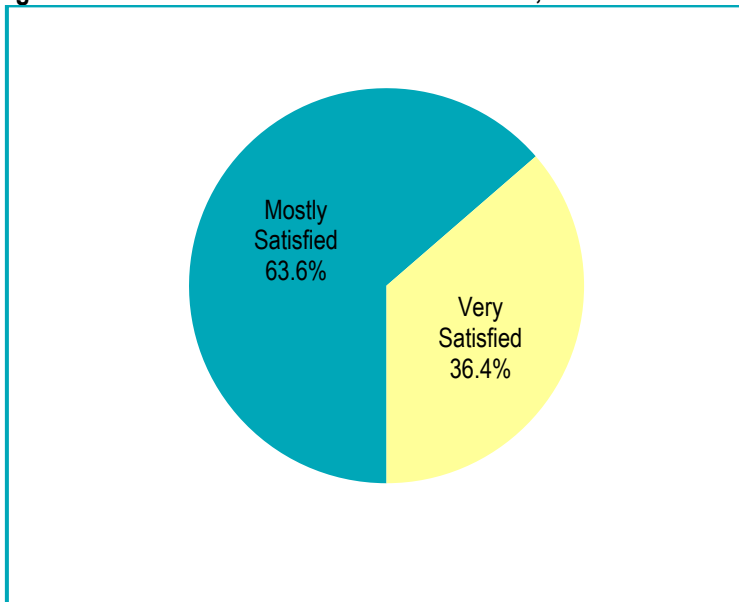

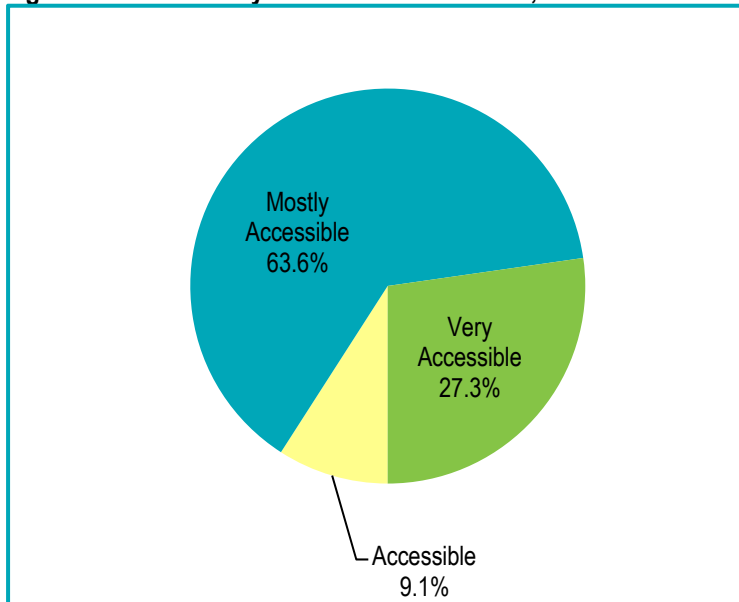

Figure 2. Accessibility of health care services, 2009



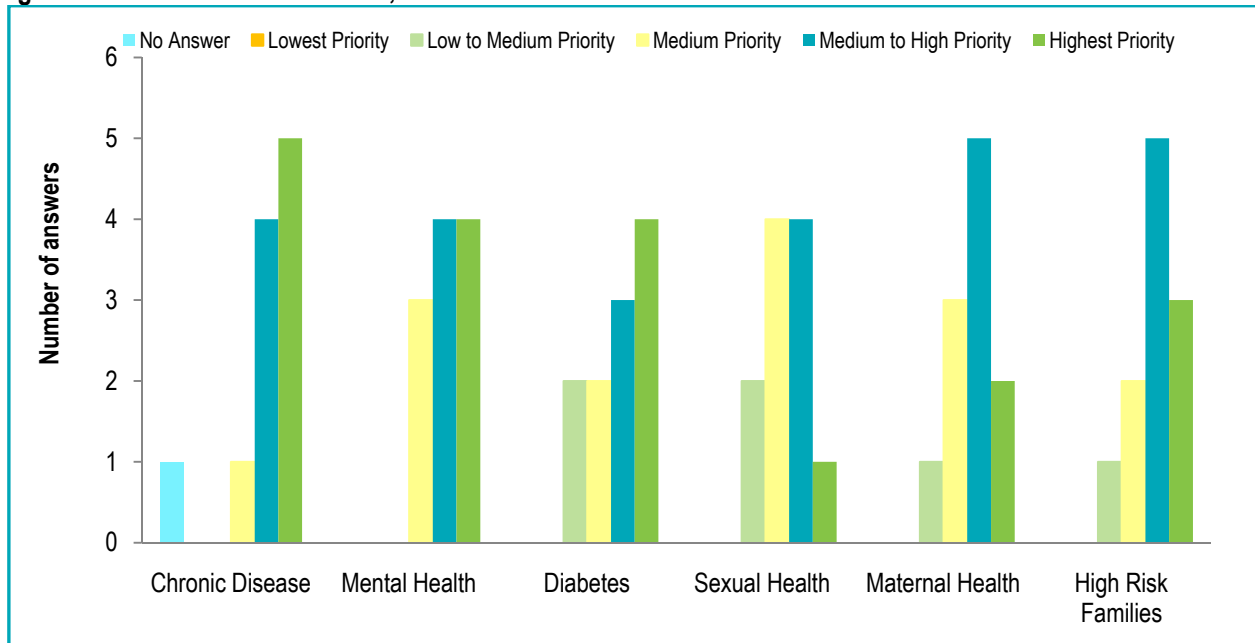

Figure 3. Prioritization of services, 2009.



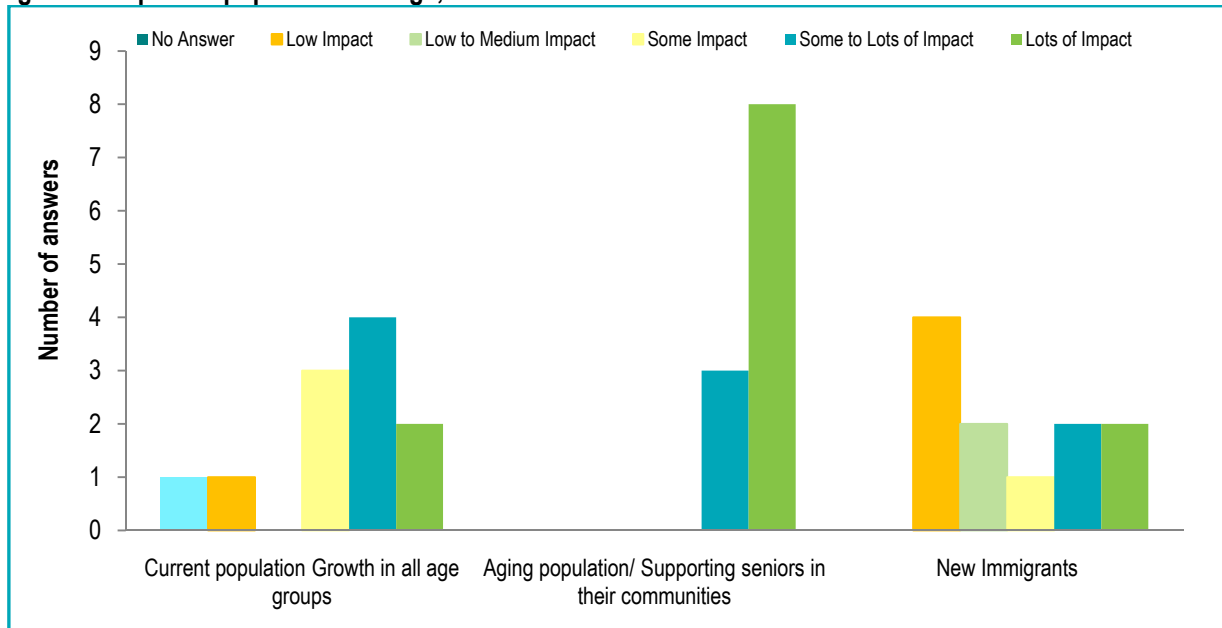

Figure 4. Impact of population change, 2009.



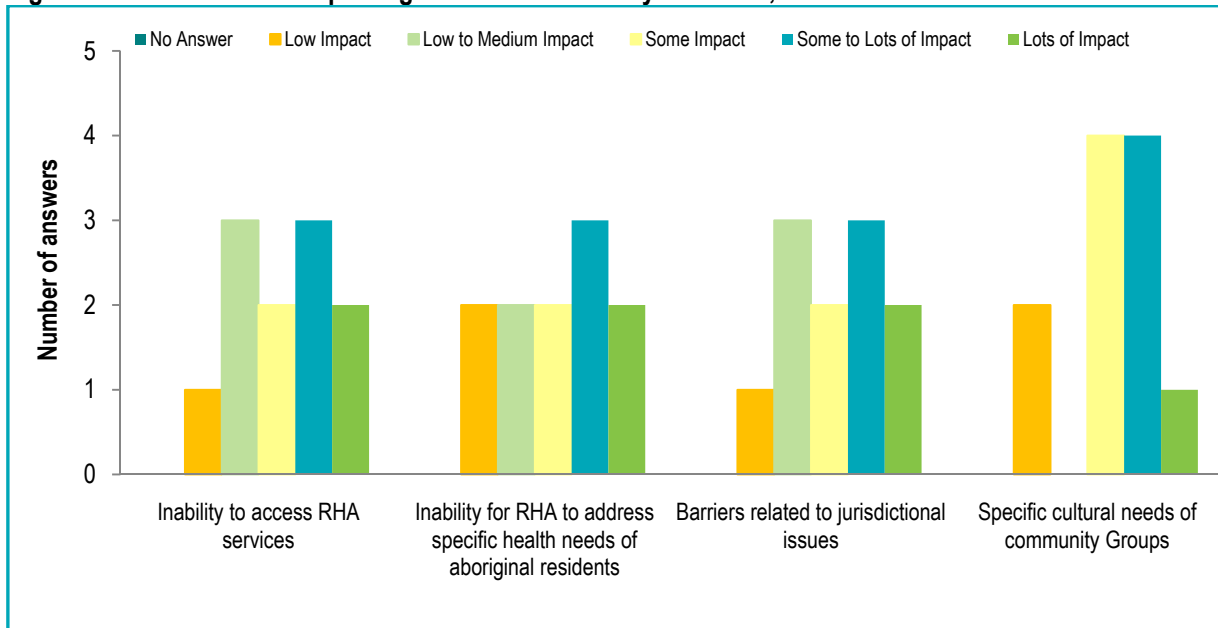

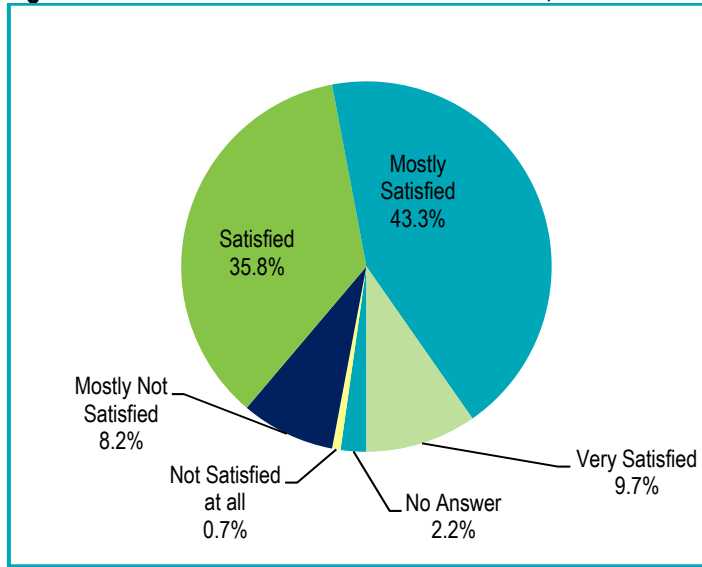

Figure 1. Satisfaction with health care services, 2009.

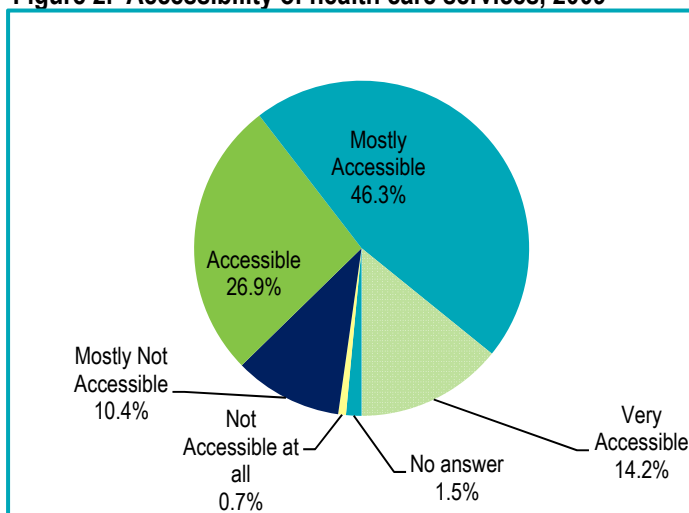

Figure 2. Accessibility of health care services, 2009



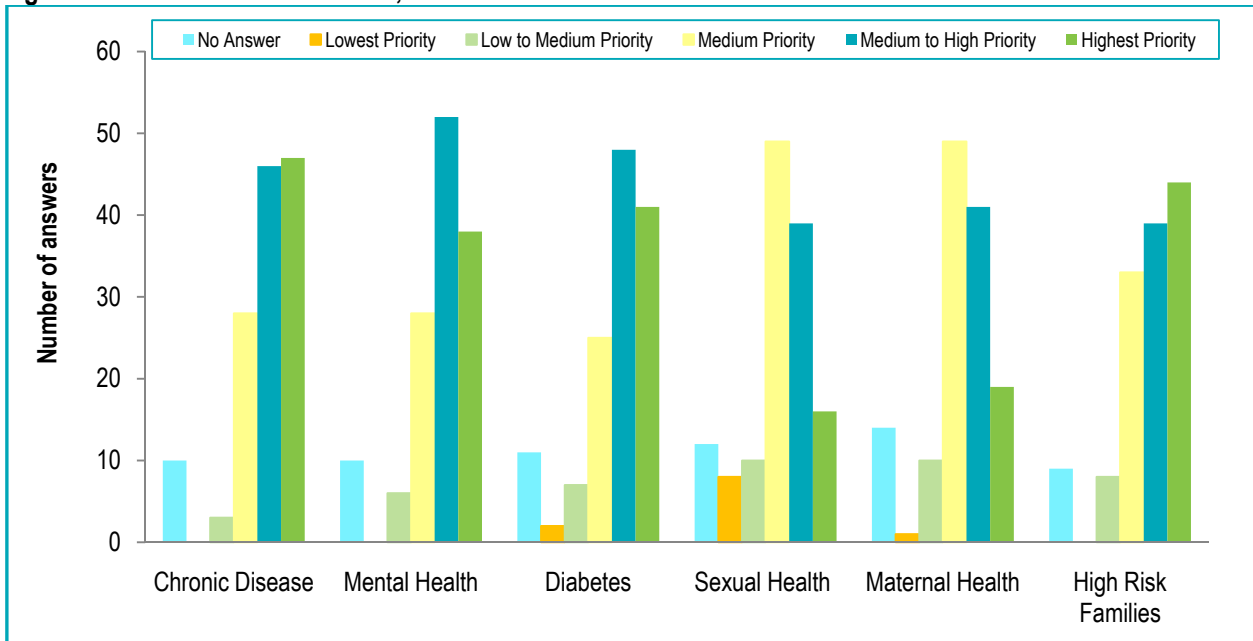

**Figure 3. Prioritization of services, 2009.**



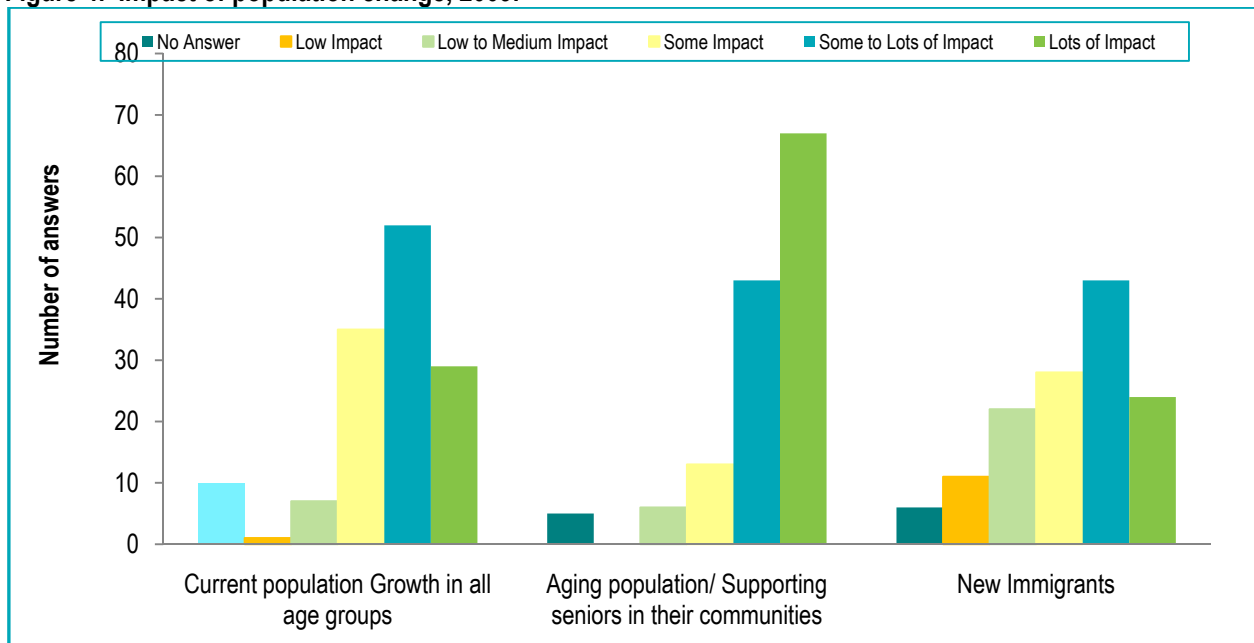
